GALLERY JAPAN introduces approximately 2,000 artists, including Living National Treasures in various fields, and promotes the beauty of Japanese traditional art to the world. In this "Special Feature on Ishikawa Kōgei ", 45 traditional craft artists associated with Ishikawa including 5 Living National Treasures (Holders of Important Intangible Cultural Property), Ryozo Kawagita, Minori Yoshita, Mamoru Nakagawa, Kunie Komori and Kazuo Yamagishi, and their artworks are being introduced. You can see the lacquerware, ceramics, textiles, metalwork, woodwork, dolls etc. made by artists pioneering a new form of beauty by combining their contemporary sensibility with the traditional techniques that have been passed down since the late 16th century. The works featured on the website can be purchased online, and a portion of the sales will be donated through the Japan *Kōgei* Association to support the recovery of Ishikawa's traditional crafts that suffered damage from the Noto Peninsula earthquake and torrential rain disaster.

About the Japan Kōgei Association

The Japan *Kōgei* Association is a public interest incorporated association consisted of traditional craft artists, mainly holders of Important Intangible Cultural Property (Living National Treasures), and technical experts etc. Currently, there are approximately 1,200 full members including holders of Important Intangible Cultural Property of traditional crafts. The "Japan Traditional *Kōgei* Exhibition" which they sponsor together with the Agency for Cultural Affairs, NHK, and Asahi Shimbun, has been held every year since 1954. The Japan Traditional *Kōgei* Exhibition is an open call exhibition where the techniques and beauty of Japanese traditional crafts are gathered. It is held to preserve and promote Japan's excellent traditional crafts in accordance with the purpose of the Law for the Protection of Cultural Properties. They also organize successors' training sessions lectured by the holders of Important Intangible Cultural Property and keep records etc. to preserve, carry on, and promote the Intangible Cultural Properties (traditional techniques). They are the only organization with no comparable counterpart to make such achievements.

About GALLERY JAPAN

GALLERY JAPAN is one of the largest online gallery in Japan to introduce approximately 2,000 traditional craft artists of various fields including Living National Treasures, and to promote the beauty of Japanese traditional art to the world. Contemporary traditional craft artists who have enhanced the traditional techniques to art and their artworks are featured on the website. Beautiful works of ceramics, textiles, lacquerware, metalwork, wood and bamboo work, dolls, glasswork, cloisonné enamel work, Kirikane cut foil embellishing, hardstone carving, ink stone carving, and Sunagowork, as well as information on the artists such as their art styles and profiles can be seen.
